Exceptional Family Member Program

The Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) is a mandatory enrollment program that works with other military and civilian agencies to provide comprehensive and coordinated community support, housing, educational, medical, and personnel services to Families with special needs. Soldiers on active duty enroll in the program when they have a family member with special needs, including spouses, children, or dependent parents who require specialized medical or educational services so their needs can be considered in the military personnel assignment process. EFMP Family Support assists families with special needs by helping them identify and access programs and services.

Eligibility for the Exceptional Family Member Program

EFMP provides support for military families with children who have disabilities or special healthcare needs. While each Service has its own EFMP, they all share the same key goal: to coordinate the assignment process so that families are not stationed in locations without sufficient medical or educational resources. Installation EFMP programs offer support services and help families access local resources and referrals. Active-duty service members with dependents who have ongoing medical, mental health, or special educational needs are required to enroll in the EFMP.

An Exceptional Family Member (EFM), is a family member, regardless of age (child or adult), with any physical, emotional, developmental, or intellectual disorder that requires special treatment, therapy, education, training or counseling. The Family member must be enrolled in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) to be enrolled in the EFMP. A Soldier who has a family member who falls into any of these categories must be enrolled in the program

EFMP Process and Renewal

The EFMP process can take up to 14 days. Soldiers are required to update their information every three years.

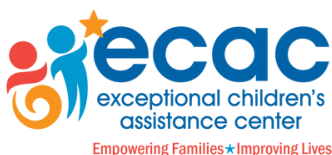
