VISION NC (formerly Vision USA) provides free eye exams to low-income, uninsured individuals in North Carolina. Eye exams are provided by North Carolina Optometric Society member optometrists who have agreed to give their time and services to help those in need. If you need an eye exam, do not have insurance, and cannot afford one, work with your social worker, case worker, charitable organization, or agency to submit an application on your behalf for VISION NC services. TRANSPORTATION AND MEDICAL TRAVEL HELP

Air Care Alliance organizes information on more than 60 different programs with volunteer pilots who help people with disabilities or special health-care needs. You can apply to them all at once on the website.

Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation offers assistance for travel related to cancer treatment for children and young adults under 21.

Children's Flight of Hope, Inc. is a nonprofit organization that gives children with critical medical needs free air transportation to and from a medical facility, if they are going for treatment.



[Corporate Angel Network](#) arranges free plane transportation for cancer patients and bone marrow donors going to or from recognized cancer treatment centers.

[Lifeline Pilots](#) is a private nonprofit organization that gives people with medical and financial needs free air transportation on a private aircraft for health-care visits.

[Mercy Medical Angels](#) helps transport people in medical and financial crises by connecting them with people or organizations that give free or low-cost patient air transportation.

[Miracle Flights for Kids](#) gives free medical transportation by air to families who need necessary medical treatment out of their home state.

The [National Children's Cancer Society](#) provides the financial assistance needed to ensure a child with cancer gets the treatment they need – whether it is across town or across the country.

[National Patient Travel Center](#) connects families to air medical transportation for children who need to see out-of-area specialists.

[Operation Liftoff](#) will provide air travel for a child younger than 18 years old and 1 parent. Any child 3 to 18 years old who has a life-threatening illness and has not received a wish trip from another organization can apply to get a dream trip too.

North Carolina's Education Student Accounts (ESA+) program is available to meet the needs of students with disabilities. Funds may be used to pay tuition and fees for eligible private schools, and for expenses such as speech therapy, tutoring services, and educational technology.

- \$9,000 annual award; students with certain designated disabilities may be eligible to receive \$17,000 a year
- Families may choose from a [variety of learning environments](#), including private schools, home schools, or co-enrollment
- Eligibility based on documentation of a disability and other [program requirement](#)
